Included is a database of over 108,000 foundations, corporate giving programs, and grantmaking public charities in the U.S. and internationally. There is also a database of over 3 million recently awarded grants.

Foundation Grants to Individuals Online

Foundation Grants to Individuals Online is the premier funding research tool for finding foundations that provide financial support to individual grantseekers. Financial support includes scholarships, student loans, fellowships, program development, internships, professorships, arts and cultural projects, research, awards/grants by nomination and general welfare.
