

House Arrest

The moment Timothy steals a credit card, his whole life changes. He didn't do it on a dare, or just to be mean, he was trying to help his family. Timothy lives with his mom and brother, Levi, who has a serious disease. The disease messes with Levi's respiratory system, and he needs a trach (a tube that goes through a hole in his neck). When Timothy is caught, he is put under house arrest, and the book is his court-ordered journal during his year on probation.

Don't let the fact that this book is poetry deter you from it. The message is powerful, and the main character will



make you laugh. Timothy says and does many things that will keep the reader hooked onto his story. K.A. Holt does a great job of putting feeling in the book and readers will feel connected with Timothy, even if they've never been under house arrest. Not only will readers love Timothy, but they'll fall in love with Levi, James, Mrs. B, and Marisol. Trust me, this is a book you will not want to miss!

I give this book five out of five stars and recommend it as reading for National Poetry Month!
