Heggan Library card holders can now download thousands of movies, television shows, music albums, eBooks, audiobooks and comics for instant streaming or temporary downloading to their smartphones, tablets and computers through a new partnership with hoopla digital (hoopladigital.com).

"With hoopla digital, we are able to do that in a more impactful way than before. The service grants our patrons ease of access to dynamic materials, while eliminating the waiting period. Cardholders may check out two items per month.

Loan periods vary by type of item checked out. Movies and television episodes can be checked out for 72 hours. Music albums are available for 7 days, and audiobooks, eBooks and comics are available for 21 days.
