What can I do if the library material I would like is not available?

Even though the Margaret Heggan Library has thousands of books, we may not have the one you need or if someone else has already checked it out. Fortunately, the library is a member of LOGIN, which gives you access to materials in all of the other libraries in Gloucester County.

You may use your Heggan Library card at any of the other libraries, or you can place a hold, and the material you requested will be delivered to the Heggan Library for you.

To place a hold on library materials, please follow these instructions:

Go to www.hegganlibrary.org.

Click on **Search Catalog**.

Look for the **title** that you want to place on hold.

Click on **Details**, which is located next to the title.

Click on **Place Hold** located in the box titled **Keep** on the left side of the screen.

Type in your 14-digit **library ID number** which is the number under the barcode on your library card.

Type in your **PIN number**.

Select where you want to pick up your book.

Type an expiration date **only** if you need it by a certain date. The hold will expire by the date that you enter.

Click **Place Hold**.

You will be notified by phone or email when your material is available to be picked up.
