Budget Cuts Force Library to Act

Over the past three years, the library's operating budget has been cut by \$250,177. In order for the library to continue to operate and provide the same level of services, the Library Board of Trustees is enforcing a few changes, which will take effect starting January 2, 2013.

First, the library will close an hour earlier at 8:00pm on Monday – Thursday. Thus, the operating hours on these days will be 10:00am-8:00pm. Second, the library will be closed on Sundays during the summer months, from Memorial Day to Labor Day.

And finally, starting January 2nd the library will charge a \$1.00 DVD rental fee on all DVD's checked out.

These changes will lessen the burden that recent cuts have placed on the library's operating budget. These were not easy decisions for the Library Board and Director to make, but after three years of significant cuts to the budget, it was finally necessary to take action.

The Library Board of Trustees and library staff appreciates your understanding during these difficult times.

Cumberland Libraries Join LOGIN

On November 1st, four additional libraries joined our library consortium, LOGIN, expanding our collection by 465,107 volumes.

Heggan Library card holders may now check out materials from Cumberland County Library and Cumberland County College Library by making a personal visit to the libraries or by placing holds on items to be sent to the Heggan Library for pickup. Pennsville Public Library and Salem Public Library will not participate in reciprocal borrowing, but have joined LOGIN for financial purposes. This shared services agreement is mutually beneficial because it expands the collection and services available to Gloucester, Cumberland, and Salem County residents, while saving the libraries money during a time of deep budget cuts.

Heggan Library Director and Vice-President of LOGIN, Kim Rinaldi, says "With the current economic situation, libraries are working hard to do more in spite of annual cuts to their operating budgets. LOGIN is an example of how we can successfully work together to increase services, while cutting costs."


In addition, Washington Township residents will now have access to two noncirculating libraries in Cumberland County—the Warren and Reba Lummis Genealogical and Historical Library of the Cumberland County Historical Society and the Beth Israel Community Library, which offers a collection of Judaica and Holocaust materials.






