## Celebrate “Black History Month” by learning about African-American History

February is “Black History Month,” a time to commemorate African-Americans who have changed the world.

One of the many databases the library has available to its customers is *Facts on File: African-American History Online*.

### African-American History Online

Exploring more than 500 years of the African-American experience, *African-American History Online* offers many exciting features, including more than 85 historical videos that bring history to life. The extensive entries in this database include subject entries, primary sources, images and videos, general and topic-specific timelines, biographies, maps and charts, and more. Users can search for entries by keyword or phrase or browse by topic and by time period—from eight historical periods relevant specifically to African-American history. In addition, biographies can be browsed by occupation and primary sources by type.

There are lots of other fun activities planned for children in February.

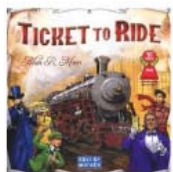

## Auto Repair Reference Center

EBSCO's newly enhanced *Auto Repair Reference Center*, offers the most comprehensive collection of automobile repair information on the market.

The *Auto Repair Reference Center* includes more than 150 easy-to-read, illustrated auto repair manuals on all auto repair procedures for about 26,000 vehicles identified in the AAIA table (a table of numerical ID codes for every car made); approximately 70,000 Technical Service Bulletins; 100,000 enhanced wiring diagrams; over 150,000 factory drawings and step-by-step photographs; and labor time guide and estimates.

Every major manufacturer for domestic and imported vehicles is represented including auto repair manuals for most vintage makes starting as far back as 1945. New repair procedures/updates are added continuously, and Technical Service Bulletins are added on a monthly or quarterly basis.
