The Wit and Wisdom of Abraham Lincoln

The library is pleased to present "The Wit and Wisdom of Abraham Lincoln" on Wednesday, February 8, at 7:00 p.m.

Discover the personal side of Abraham Lincoln in this first-person interpretation presented by Bob Gleason with the American Historical Theatre. This program covers the great man's formative years, his courtship and marriage, the beginnings and development of his abolitionist viewpoint, and his first – though not very successful – trip to Congress. Discussion points also include the causes of the Civil War, major events and turning points within the war, the Emancipation Proclamation, and the Gettysburg Address.

Bob Gleason's in-depth historical research and audience interactivity have become hallmarks of his historical portrayals. Over the years, he has been featured at the White House Visitor's Center. Ford's Theater. the National Constitution Center, and Independence Hall, as well as many schools, museums, historic sites, and libraries.

This program is funded by the Horizons Speakers Bureau of the New Jersey Council for the Humanities, a state partner of the National Endowment for the Humanities. It is produced by the American Historical Theatre.





Celebrate **Black History** Month

Black History Month is an annual celebration of achievements by African Americans and a time for recognizing the central role of African Americans in U.S. history.

Since 1976, every U.S. president has officially designated the month of February as Black History Month. Other countries around the world, including Canada and the United Kingdom, also devote a month to celebrating black history.

The library now has a pass for the African American Museum in Philadelphia that can be checked out and used for free admission to the museum for up to six people. Passes for this and many other museums are available at the Circulation Desk.

Of course, the library has a large selection of books about African American history, as well as many books by African American authors.

The library subscribes to a number of databases where additional research can be done.

African American History, a Facts on File database, features thousands of cross-referenced entries covering the entire spectrum of African American history over the past 500 years. This and many other databases are available in the library and from home.

Ancestry.com is a collection of more than 4,000 databases including U.S. Federal Census images, the American Genealogical Biographical Index, and Federal Slave Narratives. Ancestry.com is only available on library computers.

For help with databases and other research, please speak to a Reference Librarian.



Instantly borrow free digital movies, music, eBooks and more, 24/7, with your library card.

Heggan Library cardholders can download thousands of movies, television shows, music albums. eBooks, audiobooks and comics for instant streaming or temporary downloading to their smartphones, tablets and computers through Hoopla.

Cardholders may check out four items per month. Loan periods vary by type of item checked out. Items are returned automatically at the end of the lending period.

OverDrive

Download audiobooks and ebooks through the library website.

Heggan Library cardholders can also download audiobooks and ebooks to their computers or portable devices through OverDrive, an online platform available through the library website.

Thousands of titles are available. Items may be checked out for one or two weeks and are returned automatically at the end of the lending period.


