

Heggan Library cardholders can now access Kanopy by visiting the library's website and signing up to start streaming up to two films per month. Films can be streamed from any computer, television, mobile device or platform by downloading the Kanopy app for iOS, Android, AppleTV, Chromecast, or Roku.

Kanopy showcases more than 30,000 of the world's best films, including award-winning documentaries, rare and hard-to-find titles, film festival

favorites, indie and classic films, and

Kanopy is also compatible for hearing- and visually-impaired
