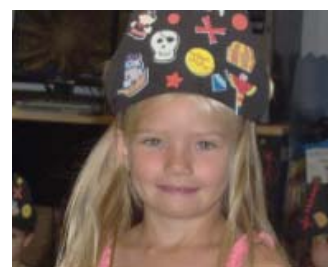

much more are available, along with many computer skills tutorials.
