Do you need a quick and easy way to find a book you will love?

The library offers access to *NoveList Plus* and *NoveList K8 Plus*, online resources that make choosing a book to read easier than ever.

*NoveList Plus* has recently been updated to make searching for books easier and quicker. Best sellers are front and center on the home page. You can also search by genre, author, series, subject, read-alikes,



and much more. You can also search by ‘appeal terms,’ which are used to describe writing style, tone, pace, and plot.

*NoveList K8 Plus* is available for children, parents, and teachers to find reading recommendations for elementary school children.

To access *NoveList Plus* and *NoveList K8 Plus*, go to the *NoveList* icon at the bottom of the library’s homepage or ask a librarian for assistance..

In September, all correct answers submitted throughout the season will be entered into the final drawing for the grand prize—a trip for two to the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum!

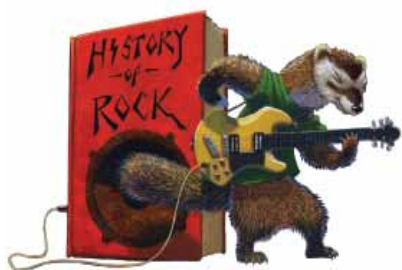
### Prizes:

## Reading Suggestions from our Intern

I like a wide variety of books. This list comprises some of my favorite reads within the past year.

First, I recommend *Rebecca* by Daphne du Maurier. Published in 1938, *Rebecca* is narrated by Mrs. De Winter, whose first name is never revealed. She is the second Mrs. De Winter—*Rebecca* was the first. The second Mrs. De Winter is haunted by *Rebecca's* perfection, and is never accepted by the main housekeeper of the Manderley estate, where they reside. But Mrs. De Winter's insecurity is unfounded as she learns a shocking secret about *Rebecca* from her husband, Max De Winter.



Second, I recommend the *Kane Chronicles* by Rick Riordan. This series of three books starts off with *The Red Pyramid*, and continues with *The Throne of Fire* and ends with *The Serpent's Shadow*. Riordan is most famous for his *Percy Jackson* series, which I also enjoyed. The *Kane Chronicles* follow Sadie and Carter Kane, who are descendants of the Egyptian pharaoh bloodline. They are out to conquer the Egyptian god, Set, who is threatening to destroy the world. They have some help along the way, but things aren't always as they seem in these books.

Lastly, for a good, fun mystery read, I recommend the *Library Lover's Mysteries* by Jenn McKinlay. In *Books Can Be Deceiving*, library director Lindsay must solve the murder of a local author. Complicating matters is the fact that the children's librarian and Lindsay's friend, Beth, was the author's girlfriend and is currently the number one suspect. In the second book of the series, *Due or Die*, Lindsay must find the murderer of a man who happens to be the husband of Carrie, the leader of the Friends of the Library group and the prime suspect.
