In another 'green' concept, the Friends will also be assisting the library to replace interior lighting with LED bulbs, saving both energy and dollars.

The jewelry sale run by the Friends in May was very successful, earning \$1600 in profit for the 3 day event. All dollars will be used to assist the library.
