Walls are up! It's getting close.



The drywall is up in the new library and moving day is getting closer.

The library will be closed for about a month while 92,379 books, DVDs, CDs, audiobooks, and other library materials are moved and placed on the shelves in the new library. Staff will be busy moving the contents of their offices and desks.



Computers and the server will need to be set up in the new building and telephones will need to be programmed installed.

After March 11, Inter-Library Loans and requests for books from other LOGIN libraries will be discontinued. Any books returned to the library after April 17 will have to be placed in the bookdrop at the new library.

During the move, library customers will be able to use their library cards at any of the other LOGIN libraries. For a list of libraries where you can use your Margaret Heggan Library card, please see page 2.

Customers will also have access to the library's website during the move. The catalog will still be available. Audiobooks and eBooks can still be downloaded. Databases and other online resources will still be accessible. There may be a brief period when the website is not available while the server is moved and set up in its new home.

If all goes as planned, the library will close sometime in mid-April and reopen sometime in the middle of May.


