Job Seekers: Learn a Second Language

The world of employment is more global than ever, and knowing a second language can often boost your chances of finding a job

Not all job news is bad. The world is still becoming more global every day. That means there are more opportunities for bilingual people, whether they speak Spanish, Mandarin or Urdu.

"It doesn't matter what career path you're taking," says Marty Abbott, Director of Education of the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages. "Knowledge of a language beyond English is going to open doors for you."

Where are the Opportunities?

Any foreign language and cultural experience can boost your resume. "More and more companies are becoming multinational," Abbott says. "It's not just Americans going abroad, but also foreign companies coming to the United States."

Potential areas include the following:

Government: "The sector we're hearing from most vocally right now is the government," Abbott says. "The CIA plans to build its language capacity over the next few years."

Health care: "Cross-cultural care" is a growing trend in health care. Some hospitals are in communities where people speak dozens of different languages. Depending on the location, interpreters often are hired to help doctors communicate with patients in different languages.

Business: "We're starting to see this real demand for employees with second language capacity so they can function in a corporate environment," Abbott says.

Employers want people who can speak a second language fluently — not just read or write it.

Using Library Resources

The Margaret Heggan Library offers Mango Languages, an online language learning course for Heggan Library cardholders.



Mango is the easiest and most effective way to learn to

speak a foreign language. It is designed to provide a complete understanding of the entire language and culture. It is available in 35 foreign language and 15 ESL courses.

The library also has a Spanish language section with fiction and non-fiction books, audiobooks, children's books and books with CDs, magazines, and a Spanish language newspaper.

Remember, your cross-cultural knowledge could open doors for your career.

Meet the Authors



Overdrive Introduces New Features for Mobile Apps

Mobile device use has increased to 22% of all checkouts of eBooks and audiobooks. OverDrive is pleased to announce new features for its mobile apps that are sure to increase that usage even further.

With the release of OverDrive[®] Media Console[™] v2.4 for Android[™], BlackBerry[®] and Windows Phone, users can:

- Return audiobooks as well as eBooks.
- Find definitions while reading using the dictionary lookup feature. Users can also use Wikipedia search.

The system requirements are still the same. The free apps can be installed on phones and devices running...

- Android v1.5 (or newer)
- Touch screen BlackBerry OS v4.7 (or newer)
- Non-touch screen BlackBerry OS v4.5 (or newer)
- Windows Phone 7 (or newer)



- Consolidated list of yours or your family's library loans and holds
- Text message alerts for holds
