The Unknown Library

Everyone is aware that the library has books. And most people know that the library has computers, DVDs, music, children’s programs, teen programs, adult programs, and computer classes. But the library offers many other services that you may not be aware of.

Downloadable eBooks and Audiobooks

Library cardholders can download digital titles anytime, anywhere by visiting the library’s OverDrive website. Books can be downloaded to many devices, and the library offers classes in downloading to your device. Most books can be checked out for a 2-week period. Please see a librarian if you need assistance.

Access to Databases

The library offers access to many databases. From auto repair to zoology, there is a database that can help you research anything. Genealogy, biography, medical, legal, business, science, literature, newspaper, and many more databases are available. Please ask a librarian if you need assistance with your research.

Mango Languages

Learn a foreign language with Mango Languages. Often compared to Rosetta Stone, Mango Languages is an online language learning system available in 49 languages and 15

ESL courses to library cardholders on their home computers or mobile devices. Because Mango uses voice recognition software, it is not available on library computers. Please see a librarian if you need assistance.

For those who download eBooks through the library, OverDrive digital collection has gotten a facelift with OverDrive’s Next Generation.

Some of the key features include:

One-Step Checkout™ Once you’ve logged in with your library card number, it just takes one click to borrow a title.



OverDrive Read™ Enables instant access to eBooks, with no software or downloading required.

All you’ll need is a computer or device with a newer web browser.

If the title is available to borrow, you can download the title—as you’ve always been able to—or you can choose to start read-

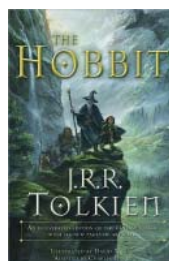

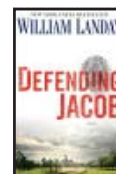
