March Mango Madness

Have you ever wanted to learn how to speak Pirate or any other foreign language? The Heggan Library offers Mango Languages, an interactive, easy-to-use language learning program that is offered online to Heggan Library card holders through the library's website. It is the most effective and fun way to learn a language. The courses are presented with an appreciation for cultural nuance and real-world application. Students learn actual conversation in an audio-visual platform.



Mango Languages courses are available in 64 foreign languages, including many ancient languages such as Biblical Hebrew and Ancient Greek. There are also 17 English as a Second Language (ESL) courses.

A number of specialty courses are also available in topics such as Medical Spanish, Octoberfest, Arab Etiquette, Wine and Cheese, Russian Slang, St. Patrick's Day, Cherokee, and many more.

Also available is Mango Premiere, which allows learners to learn a language by watching movies. There are currently 20 full-length movies available in a variety of languages.

Mango Languages is available through the library website for use on home computers or mobile devices. A microphone is needed to use the voice comparison software.

Stop by the Reference Desk during the month of March and ask for a demonstration and you will be entered to win a Mango tote bag containing some Mango swag.
