



## Hypnospace Outlaw

In theory, a computer game that acts as a computer simulator sounds kind of boring, right? At first, I definitely couldn't see what was so interesting when reading the basic summary, but, upon playing it, I knew my first impression was mistaken.



*Hypnospace Outlaw* takes place in an alternate universe version of 1999, in which an invention was created to allow people to browse the Internet in their sleep. The main objective is to find illegal content in this alternate universe version of the Internet and put a stop to it. What seems like a simple concept at first quickly turns into an amazing, story-driven masterpiece of a game. The *Twisted Tales* series, originally started by Liz Braswell, is perfect for fans of Disney movies and the

Unfortunately, just when things seem to be working out, the Prince is poisoned instead of Snow White!

I liked this book better than the actual movie because the main character is less wimpy, and the romance is much more believable. Prince Henri and Snow bond while Snow is living with the dwarves; thus, it makes more sense why they'd be in love. In the movie they meet only ONE time before the famous kiss. Snow is also more active in trying to overthrow the queen in this book, while in the movie version she just stays home cleaning until, gullibly, she eats the poisoned apple.
