Learn a Foreign Language with Mango Languages

Languages uses voice recognition software, so you must have a microphone on your home computer to use Mango Languages. It is also

available on mobile devices. It is not available on computers within the library.

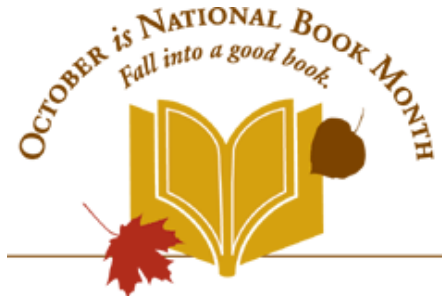
