Summer Statistics

The library was a popular place this summer. Almost 40,000 people entered the library during June, July and August.

- 277 adults and 187 children signed up for library cards.
- 53 children participated in the Children's Book Club, reading 1,055 books.
- 3,213 people attended 129 children's programs.
- 12 teens participated in the Teen Book Club, reading 114 books.
- 6 teen programs were offered and were attended by 52 teens.
- 30 adults participated in the Adult Reading Contest.
- 175 adults attended one of 9 adult programs that were offered.
