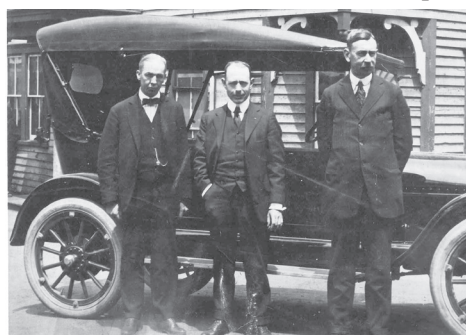

## The Frontmobile and the Bateman Manufacturing Iron Age Works

The Margaret E. Heggan Free Public Library and the Washington Township Historic Preservation Commission are pleased to present "The Frontmobile and the Bateman Iron Age Works" on Monday, October 27, at 7:00 p.m.

Join us in celebrating the 350<sup>th</sup> birthday of New Jersey and the innovations that were developed by the Bateman brothers at their manufacturing plant in the Grenloch Terrace section of Washington Township.

The Bateman brothers, who are respon-



sible for bringing the railroad to Grenloch Terrace, also developed one of the first front wheel drive vehicles in America.

This program will be presented by Paul Schopp, former executive director of the Camden County Historical Society. He is the author of many books about the history of New Jersey and has just been appointed the first official historian for the 101-year-old Camden County Historical Society.

This program was made possible by a grant from the New Jersey Council for the Humanities, a state partner of the National Endowment for the Humanities. Any views, findings, conclusions or

## Summer Statistics

The library was a popular place this summer. More than 38,000 people entered the library during June, July and August.

- 424 people signed up for library cards.
- 63 children participated in one of two Children's Book Clubs, reading 1,497 books.
- 3,469 people attended 122 children's programs.
- 155 adults attended one of 6 adult programs that were offered.
- 60,528 items were checked out.
- 3,149 items were added to the library collection.
