Banned Books Week September 23-29

Banned Books Week is an annual event celebrating the freedom to read. Banned Books Week was launched in 1982 in response to a sudden surge in the number



of challenges to books in schools, bookstores and libraries. Typically held during the last week of September, it highlights the value of free and open access to information. Banned Books Week brings together the entire book community—librarians, booksellers, publishers, journalists, teachers, and readers of all types—in shared support of the freedom to seek and to express ideas, even those some consider unorthodox or unpopular.

The 2018 theme, "Banning Books Silences Stories," is a reminder that everyone needs to speak out against the tide of censorship.

Frankenstein Turns 200!

In 1818, Mary Shelley published the first edition of *Frankenstein*, a novel that has captured our imagination for 200 years.

On a stormy night in June of 1816 at Lord Byron's villa on Lake Geneva, Lord Byron, Mary, her husband Percy Bysshe Shelley, and other guests decide to have a ghost story writing competition.

Shelley was aware of the experiments by Luigi Galvani and Alessandro Volta on the connection between electricity and muscular motion. She captured the cutting-edge science of her time and wrote what is considered to be the first science fiction novel.

Since the publication of *Frankenstein*, there have been more than 300 editions of the novel, at least 90 films, and hundreds of comic books and academic books inspired by it.
