## A Look at the Past Year and a Glimpse into the Future

2009 was another busy year for the Margaret E. Heggan Free Public Library. More than 170,000 people walked through the doors of the library in 2009, and more than 1,700 new library cards were issued.

This year witnessed the approval by the State of our plan to purchase a 20,000 sq. ft. building, and within seven years, expand it to 30,000 sq.ft. We have the approval of the Washington Township Council to expend the library funds for this project. We have negotiated an agreement to purchase the EIRC building on Delsea Dr., and will finalize the purchase in January 2010.

In April, a customer checked out the 6-millionth item from the library. In total, over 210,000 items were checked out of the library during 2009.



To celebrate National Library Week in April, the Margaret Heggan Library joined with eight other Gloucester County libraries to host “Meet the Authors” at the Washington Township Senior Center. Twenty-seven local authors participated.



More than 1500 attended the library’s Summer Reading programs. This year’s theme was “Be Creative @ your library.” Children enjoyed musical performances, crafts, magic, and art throughout the summer.

In July, the Friends of the Library’s book, *Images of America: Washington Township, Gloucester County* was published. The 128-

page book contains vintage photos of the township. All proceeds from the sale of this book will be used to support the library.

The Friends of the Library were also the recipients of a “Books for Babies” grant which was used to purchase kits to be distributed to new mothers in the township.

Demand for computer classes was high. 15 computer classes were held during the year.

In 2010, the Margaret E Heggan Free Public Library is embarking on a new chapter. We will see a new director and the completion of the first phase of the new home for the library. We look forward to 2010 and all the changes to come.

## Library Director Retires

It is with some sadness that the library bids farewell to Library Director Linda Snyder. Linda is retiring after 36 years as Library Director.

When Linda started as Director, the library was located on Ganttown Road in a 24’ x 16’ “Russian House” box-type structure with no running water.

The library now helps the experienced antiques dealer and the novice collector identify, research and price art, antiques and collectibles with Gale's *Price It! Antiques & Collectibles*.

Thanks to *Price It! Antiques & Collectibles*, library patrons have access to a database of over 25 million antiques & collectibles records from which to find and compare pricing of these items.

Through Gale's partnership with GoAntiques, Inc. ([www.GoAntiques.com](http://www.GoAntiques.com)), the largest online virtual marketplace for art, antiques and collectibles, *Price It! Antiques & Collectibles* users have access to information that identifies and prices these pieces from a variety of internationally recognized sources. Users simply type in keywords for the item they wish to value and *Price It! Antiques & Collectibles* searches millions of records from a variety of data sources, ascertaining the item's current value and presenting historical pricing information, photos and descriptions for the same or similar items.

On January 25, the group will discuss *Killer Weekend* by Ridley Pearson.

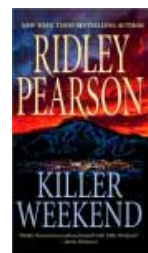
