Got a question? We have answers 24/7

QandANJ.org is a 24/7 web-based service that lets the user connect online with a real librarian—one-to-one in real-time—to help you get answers to your questions, any time and anywhere you have internet access. Unlike other “expert” sites on the web, there is no charge to use this service. All you need is a library card from a participating NJ library.

QandANJ.org is staffed by professional librarians from participating libraries across the state of New Jersey, including the Margaret E. Heggan Free Public Library. When you start a QandANJ.org session, a librarian will chat and co-browse with you in real-time.

QandANJ.org uses technology that combines internet chat with the ability to send web sites and other information directly to your computer. Designed to provide fast answers from web-based resources, including specialty databases funded by libraries, QandANJ.org combines the speed of the Internet with the information smarts of librarians.

QandANJ.org is open for service 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, except Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year’s Day.

QandANJ.org is accessible from the library’s website. Simply click on the QandANJ icon on the bottom of the page.



QandANJ.org is supported by the New Jersey State Library, managed by South Jersey Regional Library Cooperative, staffed by member libraries in the New Jersey Library Network and funded by the Institute of Museum and Library Services, an independent federal agency whose mission is to create strong libraries and museums that connect people to information and ideas.

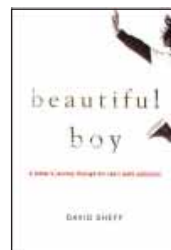
