Avoid overdues with email alerts! Let Library ELF help you manage your library loans.

It’s hard to keep track of all the library materials you have out on loan. Families have multiple cards, and many materials have different due dates. Books are misplaced or forgotten until they are overdue.

Library ELF is a tool to help you manage your library loans. Once you sign up for this free service, you will receive email alerts before items are due. You will also be alerted to overdue materials.

Basic Library ELF is a free service. To subscribe, go to www.hegganlibrary.org and click on the link at the bottom of the page.

Premium service, which provides additional features, is available for a fee.

Library ELF is a private service which is owned and run independently of the library. You can read their Privacy Policy on their web site.

Friends awarded 'Books for Babies' grant

In partnership with Nordstrom, and the Association of Library Trustees, Advocates, Friends and Foundations (ALTAFF), a division of the American Library Association (ALA), the Friends of the Margaret E. Heggan Free Public Library have been awarded a grant for 500 to match \$1,000 raised by the Friends for purchasing 'Books for Babies' kits from ALTAFF.



'Books for Babies' is a national literacy program that acquaints parents of newborns with the important role they play in the development of their children. Parents are presented with a 'Books for Babies' kit containing a board book, a bib, information about the library, and a variety of brochures with reading tips and early literacy information from nationally recognized educational organizations. One goal of the program is to inform parents about library programs for children and to encourage them to join the library. Grants to purchase the early childhood literacy kits were awarded to 10 organizations across the country through a \$10,000 donation given by Nordstrom.

ALTAFF is a division of ALA with approximately 5,000 Friends of the Library, Trustee, Foundation and individual members and affiliates representing hundreds of thousands of library supporters.

Books for Babies kits will be distributed to new parents through a partnership with the Women's Center of Kennedy Hospital in Washington Township. Joanne Naughton, RN, IBCLC, Childbirth Education Coordinator of the Center, will be distributing kits at various programs provided by the Women's Center.

An educational/social New Mom's Night Out will be held at the library in March where expectant or new mothers can learn about the benefits of reading to their babies. Kits will be available at that time as well.

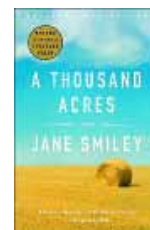
