The New Jersey State Library has received a federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) Broadband Technology Opportunity Program (BTOP) award.

The award consists of a \$5.1 million grant from the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) and matching funds of \$1.5 million from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation gave an additional \$150,000 to the New Jersey State Library.

The goal of the program is to help in the economic recovery of the state by giving libraries tools to expand services to the unemployed and underemployed by enhancing training and internet availability in New Jersey libraries.

As a result of this award, the library will be able to offer more computer classes and additional databases and online resources for job seekers and small businesses.

Library cardholders will now have access to Career Transitions, Job & Career Accelerator, and Frost & Sullivan marketing reports.

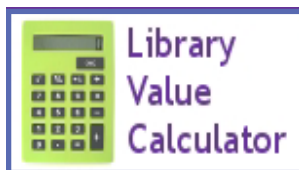

A recently passed state law requires your public library tax to be displayed separately from the general municipal tax. The amount of your general municipal tax line was reduced by the exact amount that your public library tax line now shows, so it doesn't result in any increase in your taxes.

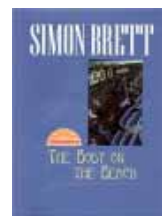
