## Library now has *The Great Courses*

The library is pleased to announce that now has a large selection of *The Great Courses*. Courses in economics, history, religion, genetics, psychology, literature, social issues, and more are available.

## New Jersey State Library Talking Book & Braille Center kiosk available in the library

The New Jersey State Library Talking Book & Braille Center (TBBC) wants to give every New Jersey resident an opportunity to learn about and explore its free library services, which are available to those who cannot read standard print books due to a visual or physical disability. To bring these services to the attention of New Jersey residents, TBBC has installed thirty-nine Outspoken Library computer kiosks across New Jersey.



Each Outspoken Library kiosk has live links to services administered through TBBC, such as TBBC's very own Audiovision Newspaper Reading Service and the National Federation for the Blind's Newline with over 300 newspapers, magazines and wire services. Access to the Braille and Audio Reading Download (BARD) site is also available. BARD currently provides over 20,000 digital books as well as current and past issues of 42 magazines for download which can be played on a TBBC-issued digital talking book player. Video demonstrations and instructions on how to do a BARD download are also found on each Outspoken Library kiosk.

Library staff are available to demonstrate how the kiosk works, explain the eligibility, provide applications and explain the application process. Once certified by TBBC, users will receive a login ID and password to access BARD at home.

## About the NJSL Talking Book & Braille Center

### Who Do We Serve?

The services of the New Jersey State Library Talking Book & Braille Center (TBBC) are available without charge to anyone living in New Jersey who for any physical reason cannot read regular printed books. Readers served by TBBC include people with a physical disability that prevents them from holding a book or turning its pages. Anyone who is legally blind to those totally blind are also eligible. Individuals with a learning disability that is certified by a medical doctor may also use the TBBC's services.

### What Do We Have?

The New Jersey State Library Talking Book & Braille Center provides books in Braille, cassette, and digital. TBBC's collection has more than 60,000 book titles and 76 periodicals available. Machines for playing the recorded materials are available on loan from the TBBC. Audiovision, the TBBC's newspaper reading service, is available to registered residents in New Jersey.

### How Do You Get Services?

Each new reader must complete an application and provide a statement from a doctor, nurse, social worker, or librarian certifying eligibility for the program. Service from TBBC is by postage-free mail.

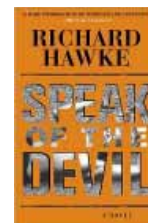
