Whether through offering ebooks and computer classes, programs for job seekers or those to support early literacy, librarians listen to the community they serve, and they respond.

"Service to the community has always been the focus of the library," said Library

Director Kim Rinaldi. "While this aspect has never changed, libraries have grown and evolved in how they provide for the needs of every member of their community."

The library is celebrating National Library Week by providing a variety of children's programs, as well as a special New Jersey Council for the Humanities program, "Andy Warhol and Pop Art."

The library will also join with 8 other Gloucester County libraries to present the sixth annual "Meet the Authors."

First sponsored in 1958, National Library Week is a national observance sponsored by the American Library Association (ALA) and libraries across the country each April.

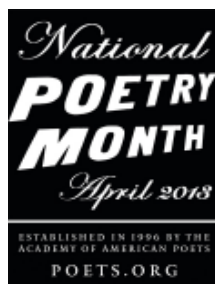
