Library sees large increase in visits and circulation during June

Since the library reopened on June 1, there has been a large increase in the number of people visiting the library. In June, 32,643 people entered the library, a 20% increase over last year. Circulation also increased. During June, 25,744 items were checked out, 28% more than June 2010.



Many people registered for a Heggan Library card during June. 316 new library cards were issued. That is a 136% increase over last year.



The Reference Librarians were busy as they answered 2,250 reference questions, a 240% increase. Computer usage increased 174%.

Customers are also taking advantage of the free downloadable ebooks available through the library. Ebook downloads increased 123%.

Do you need a quick and easy way to find a book you will love?

The library offers access to *NoveList Plus* and *NoveList K8 Plus*, online resources that make choosing a book to read easier than ever.

NoveList Plus has recently been updated to make searching for books easier and quicker. Best sellers are front and center on the home page. You can also search by genre, author, series, subject, read-alikes, and

much more. You can also search by 'appeal terms,' which are used to describe writing style, tone, pace, and plot.

NoveList K8 Plus is available for children, parents, and teachers to find reading recommendations for elementary school children.




