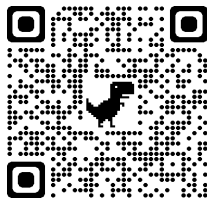
SUMMER READING ON BEANSTACK!

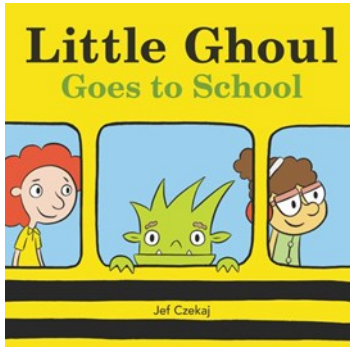

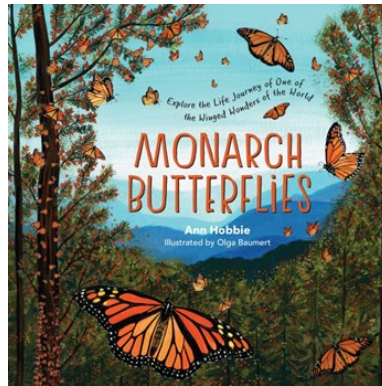

NEW BOOKS WE LOVE IN THE LIBRARY!



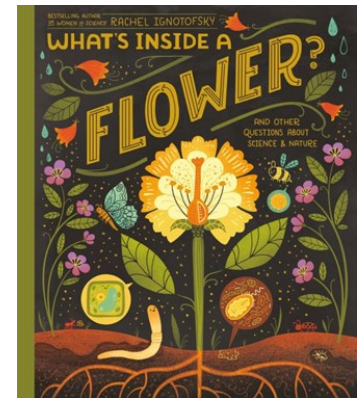
Little Ghoul Goes to School, written and illustrated by Jef Czekaj

A completely adorable story about a monster on her way to the first day of school. Little Ghoul is fretting over the start of school; she worries that the day won't be dreary and rainy, that her principal will smile at her and ruin everything, and that she'll even have a delicious peanut butter sandwich with a chocolate chip cookie for lunch – yuck! Is she ready for this? *Little Ghoul Goes to School* is fun for any young reader who might be feeling nervous about the start of school, themselves – it's equal parts silly and a little gross, but also tremendously reassuring. We love it!



Monarch Butterflies: Explore the Life Journey of One of the Winged Wonders of the World, written by Ann Hobbie, and illustrated by Olga Baumert

This is a beautifully illustrated book that tells all about the life cycle of the monarch butterfly, their cultural significance, and the many challenges that face monarch butterflies everywhere. Highly recommended for its excellent and informative text, and gorgeous pictures. Plant milkweed! Save a monarch!



What's Inside a Flower?, written and illustrated by Rachel Ignotofsky
