Coming This Fall: Chapter Chat Mysteries!





Shadow and Bone and Siege and Storm by Leigh Bardugo

I read **Shadow and Bone** after watching the Netflix series, and I was not disappointed. Alina, the main character, has an extremely witty personality with a dry sense of humor, which gives this book almost a comedic aspect. Alina and her friend Mal both have relatable personalities which keeps the book grounded in the midst of its fantastical world. It's a great introduction to the **Grishaverse**, combining multiple genres all in one book. This novel is a must-

read for YA fantasy fans.

Siege and Storm is successful in continuing Alina's journey from Shadow and Bone. While I think this second book is not quite as good as the first book in the series, I still recommend it. Siege and **Storm** introduces vital information that sets up a third book in the series. Also, the characters develop further in this book which makes the story that much more interesting. Some characters who are only briefly mentioned in Shadow and Bone are highlighted in this book, which I really enjoyed. Definitely give this book a try after reading the first one in the series!
