

Library Funding Update

Thanks to the efforts of 1000's of library lovers across the state, a portion of library funding that was cut in the original budget has been restored.






this restoration of some funds will affect statewide library services, this DOES represent a significant victory and NJLA is grateful to all library advocates throughout the state.

Heggan Library awarded grant

The library has been awarded a \$1,200 grant from the New Jersey State Library to purchase a computer station dedicated to Homework Help NJ. The money is part of a grant to the New Jersey State Library from the Gates Foundation Staying Connected program.

The Heggan Library is one of 10 libraries in the state to be awarded this grant. The library has consistently posted one of the ten highest in-library usage rates of Homework Help NJ and Adult Career Center.



Johnpaul Ferraiolo gets online tutoring from Homework Help NJ on the new computer purchased with a grant from the NJ State Library. Homework Help NJ provides free one-onone online tutoring from Tutor.com for students in kindergarten through college. This service is available everyday from 2:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

The Adult Career Center offers job seekers and adult learners customized help and resources to meet their needs in conducting a job search, writing a resume, preparing for the GED or other tests, or going back to school.

Homework Help NJ and Adult Career Center is supported by the New Jersey State Library through a generous grant from PSE&G.

Library customers can access the Homework Help NJ and Adult Career Center from within the library or from home with a library card. To access from home, go to the library website, www.hegganlibrary.org, and click on the Homework Help NJ icon on the library homepage.


TEEN BOOK CLUB GRADES 6-12
