## Take the Library with You on Vacation

Are you planning a vacation this summer? Whether you are heading to the beach, or the mountains, or your own backyard, you can still take advantage of many of the library's resources.

### Audiobooks

Audiobooks are great to listen to on long car rides. The library has a large selection of audiobooks for children, teens, and adults. Or you can download one through OverDrive on the library's website.

### eBooks

If you will be doing your summer reading on an eReader or other mobile device, the library offers free downloadable eBooks through OverDrive. Thousands of titles are available for download via the library's website. Books can be borrowed for two weeks, and then are 'returned' automatically. And no matter where you are, if you can access the library website, you can download an eBook. Complete information, instructions, and device compatibility can be found on the OverDrive website, which is accessible through the library website.

### Summer Reading for School

The library has many copies of the required and recommended summer reading titles

for Washington Township Public Schools, as well as titles from some local private schools. Some of the titles are also available as audiobooks.

### Learn a Foreign Language

If you're traveling to a foreign country this summer, you can brush up on the language with Mango Languages. Often compared to Rosetta Stone, Mango Languages is an online language learning system available in 49 languages and 15 ESL courses to library cardholders on their home computers or mobile devices.

### Library Anywhere

Library Anywhere is a free app available for smart phones and other popular mobile devices. All you need to do is go to your device's app store and search for Library Anywhere. Once you have the app and have located the Margaret Heggan Library, you will be able to search the catalog for books, movies, music and more, download eBooks and audiobooks, check your account, place holds, renew materials, and find library events.

Before heading to your vacation destination, please make sure your library card is up to date. That way you be able to take the library with you on vacation.
