


FOR TEENS AND TWEENS

Off Balance by Aileen Erin

Aileen Erin is my favorite author and if you read Off Balance, you'll see why! This book picks up a few weeks from where she leaves us in her first book of this series, Off Planet. Every night since Amihanna (with a mother from **Earth** and a father from Aunare) escaped from her prison on Abaddon, she wakes up sick from night terrors. Her painful near-death experiences on Abaddon haunt her, but fortunately she has **Lorne** to help her get through it. Unfortunately, even he can be frustrating! Why does he continuously call her his "shalshasa"? What does that really mean? How does she even feel about him?

I am very happy with the character development in this book. The author introduces *Lorne's* point of view, so the reader sees things from his side and learns more about him. It is interesting to see the story from the side of a "full *Aunare"* as well as someone who is half human. If you're looking for a sci-fi dystopian series to try, then you will enjoy this series!
