
The pets from FURever as Friends will be here on Thursdays, March 7 and 21 at 6:30 p.m. to listen to children read.

March 21 will also be a Welcome Spring Party.



DIRECTOR'S CORNER

The Friends of the Margaret E. Heggan Free Public Library had a very successful 2018!

At their meeting in January 2019, they made an annual donation to the library in the amount of \$8.951.46. These funds were used to purchase 360 books for the library. The collection includes a mixture of books for all ages, including children, teens. FRIENDS and adults.

The books purchased span the entire library collection and include

nonfiction, biographies, and fiction, including genres such as romance, science fiction, fantasy, and mystery. Book plates were added to all of the 360 books, noting that the book was purchased thanks to the generosity of the Friends of the Margaret E. Heggan Free Public Library.

Over the thirteen years that the group has been in existence, they have made a total of \$93,552.24 worth of purchases and cash donations to the library.
