Browsing by Appointment Now Available

The library is pleased to announce that it will begin offering Browsing by Appointment.

Heggan Library cardholders may contact the Reference Librarian at 856-589-3334 x 222 to set up an appointment to browse a limited portion of the collection.



Once you arrive for your appointment, the librarian will escort you to the browsing area. All items handled by patrons during the browsing appointment that are not checked out will be quarantined per a

timeframe set by the library. Patrons may not reshelve materials that have been removed from the shelf.

You may check out your selections from the cart that same day.

This service is available to Heggan Library cardholders in good standing only. Appointments are available in thirty minute time slots. Please note that a mask must be worn and cover both your nose and mouth at all times. Staff will check temperatures of participants before they enter the building. You will be required to use hand sanitizer upon entering the building and maintain a distance of six feet from others while in the building.

This service is available for adults, children, and teens. The questionnaires can be found under the Adult Services and Youth Services tabs on the library's website. Just look for "Your Next Great Read."



The Virtual Teen & Tween Library Is Open



Virtual browsing is now available for middle and high school students with our Virtual Teen & Tween Library. With over thirty slides in the virtual library, students from grade 6–12 can find a varied array of books and resources. From directions on how to arrange a contactless curbside pick up and a cartoon on how to get your own library card to browsing books with linked summaries, reviews, or YouTube book trailers, there's something for everyone!

Book slides range from award winners to favorite authors, genres, and series. Several library employees have slides offering their favorites and Teen Advisory Board members have begun creating their own slides of favorites—complete with their own Bitmoji.

From the very first slide, you'll find links to each slide in the presentation. You can also browse our newest arrivals to the collection, or click on objects to link out to related Internet articles. Some objects link out to safe YouTube for library parodies of popular music or videos of the author.

Not sure what you're looking for? There are a couple ways to browse. Every book cover in the presentation is a book we have either in print or as an eBook. Most of the book covers are links to summaries and reviews

to help you decide what you want to take out. For books where there is a physical copy in the library, click on the Heggan logo on that slide and it will open a link for our catalog so you can put a hold on the book. If a selected title is only available in eBook, it also tells whether it is available from Hoopla or OverDrive. If you've never tried an eBook before or never put a book on hold through your home computer, you can call the reference desk for help getting started. (856-589-3334)



If you just want an idea of what to read, take a look at the side for GoodReads. Click on your grade number to see what readers think are the best for your level.

Of course the Virtual Teen & Tween Library, just like the Heggan Library, offers more than books. There are a couple slides devoted to health and other useful information. There's also a Make It Room slide with links to DIY projects from cooking and drawing to creating and refurbishing. There's even a slide with our Teen and Tween Fall Programs line-up. 
