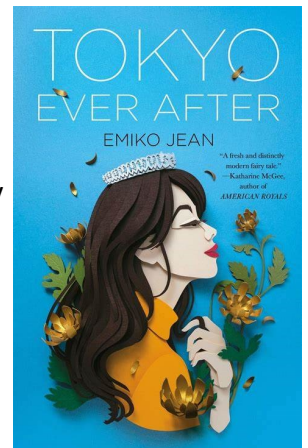


Nancy Drew Diaries: A Capitol Crime by Carolyn Keene reviewed by TAB member A. M.
