BANNED BOOKS WEEK SEPTEMBER 29–OCTOBER 7

Banned Books Week is an annual celebration of the freedom to read. This freedom, not only to choose what we read, but also to select from a full array of possibilities, is firmly rooted in the First Amendment. Although we enjoy an increasing quantity and availability of information and reading material, we must ensure that access to this material is preserved.

Sex, profanity, and racism remain the primary categories of objection. Frequently, challenges are motivated by the desire to protect children. Individuals may restrict what they themselves or their children read, but they must not call on governmental or public agencies to prevent others from reading or seeing that material.

Celebrate the "Freedom to Read" by reading a banned or challenged book and entering our contest to win a \$25 Barnes and Noble gift card. Details are on the display near the front of the library, beginning September 4.
