History Originally owned by Roland Line. Commenced service as an emigrant and cargo carrier. Services: (a) Bremen-New York, (b) Bremen-Baltimore, (c) Bremen-Quebec-Montreal. Renamed Wyandotte (1917) United States Government. Scrapped at Baltimore in 1924. Sister ship: **Wittekind**.

Renamed: (a) Iroquois (1917), (b) Freedom (1919) United States. Scrapped in 1924. Sister ship: Willehad. Note: Originally built for Roland Line.

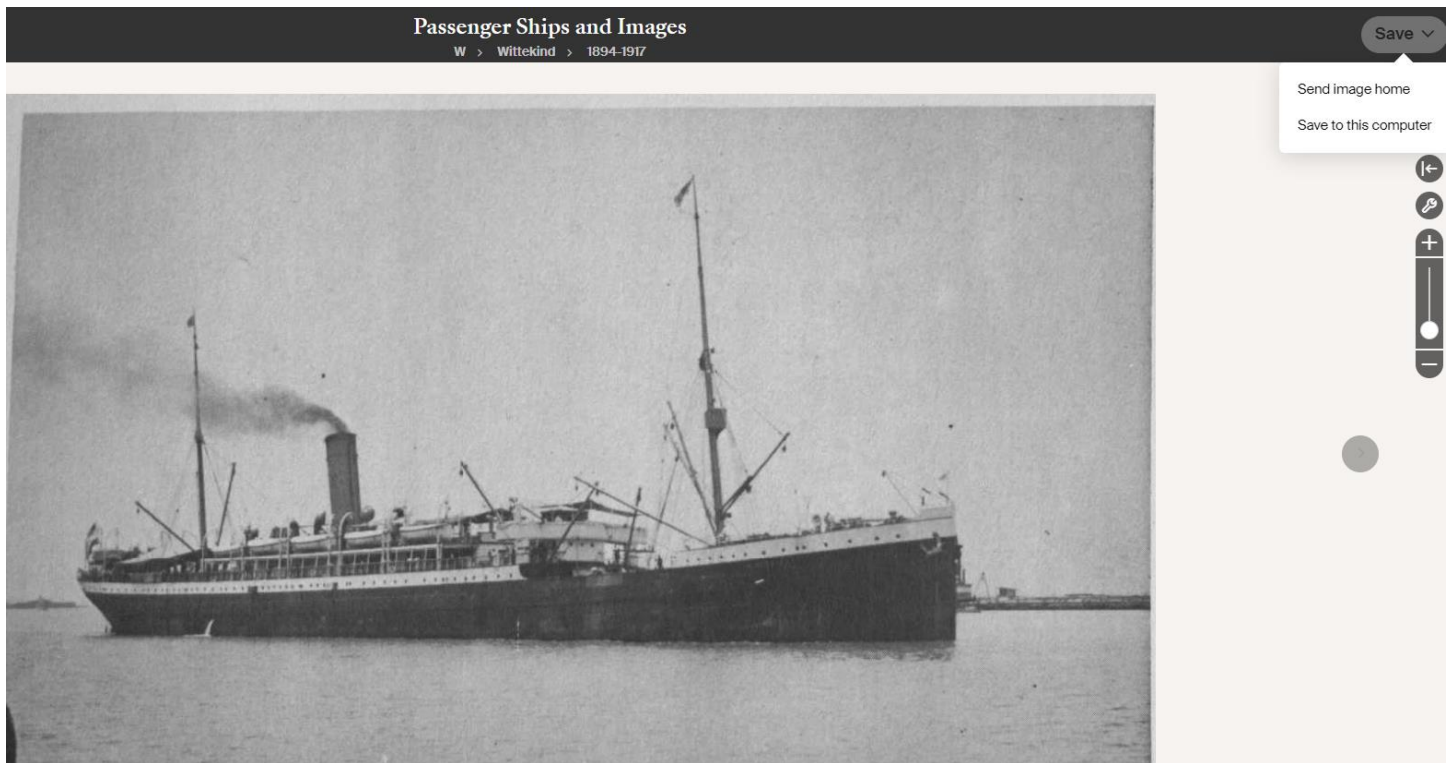

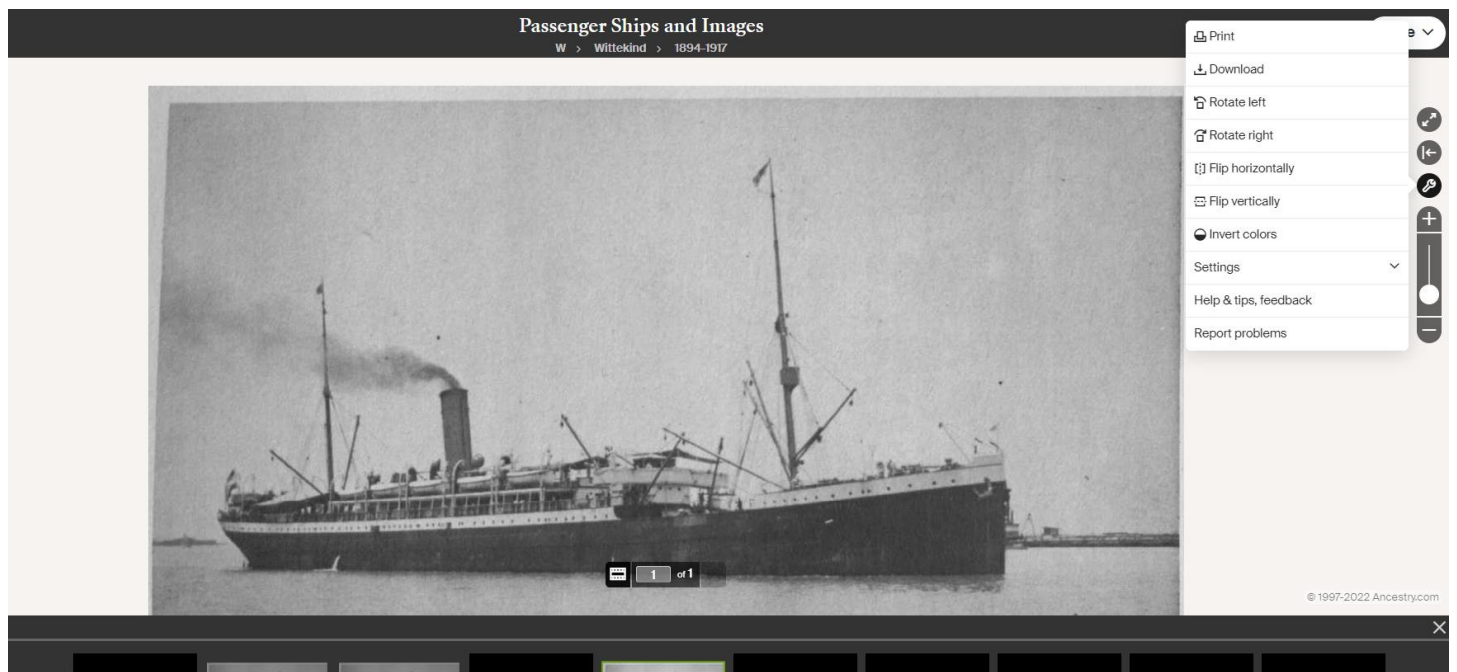
