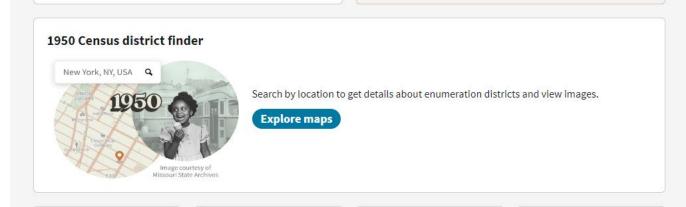

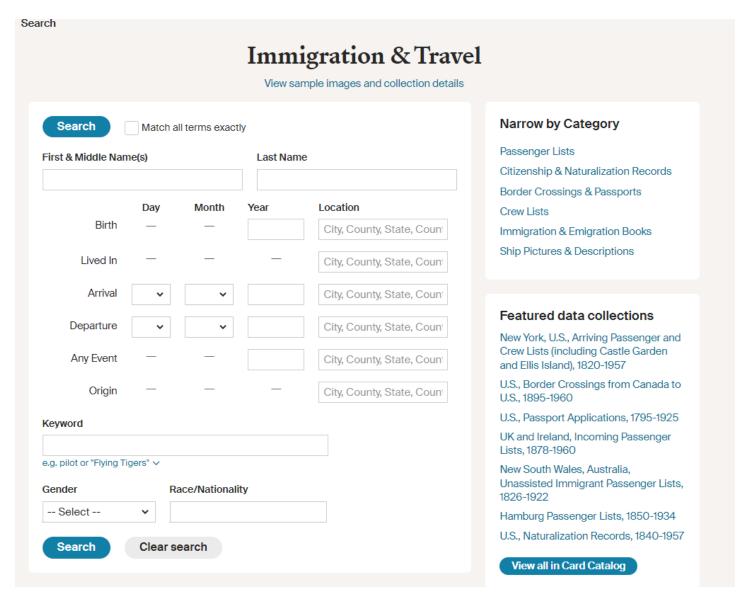

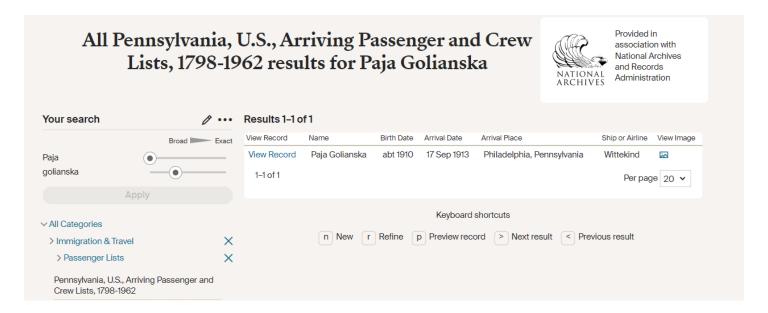
3. You can do a search from the main **Passenger Lists screen**. This is best if you do not know the port where your ancestor entered the country. You can also search the list from a specific port. The smaller collections are located under the heading **Featured Data Collections**. There are several that are highlighted. You can click **View All in Card Catalog** to see a list of all the collections. You can refine your search by using the filters under **Browse Catalog**.

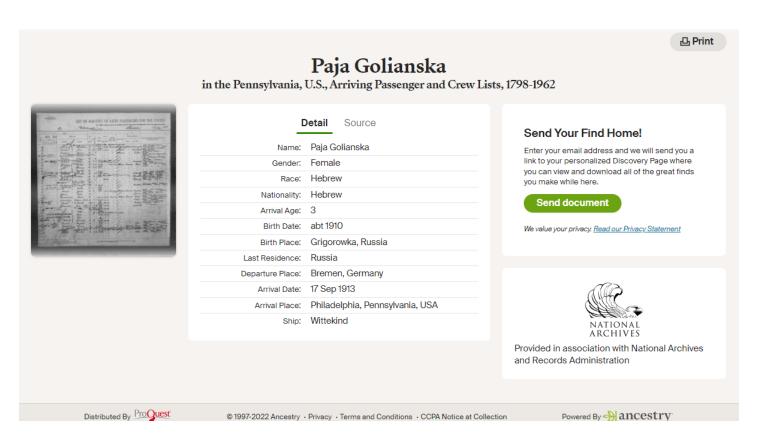
4. Type your **relative's name** in the search field. Remember that the name you know is not necessarily your relative's birth name.

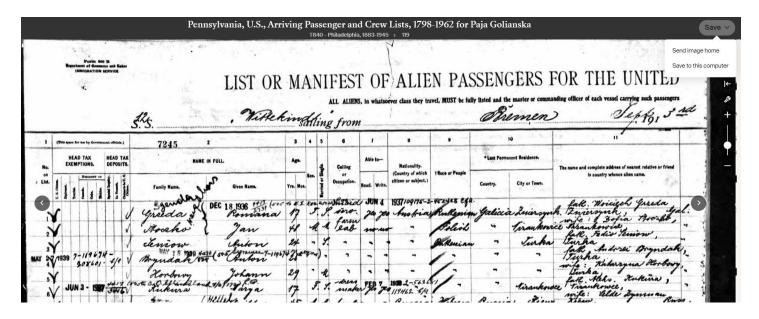
5. Click **Search**.



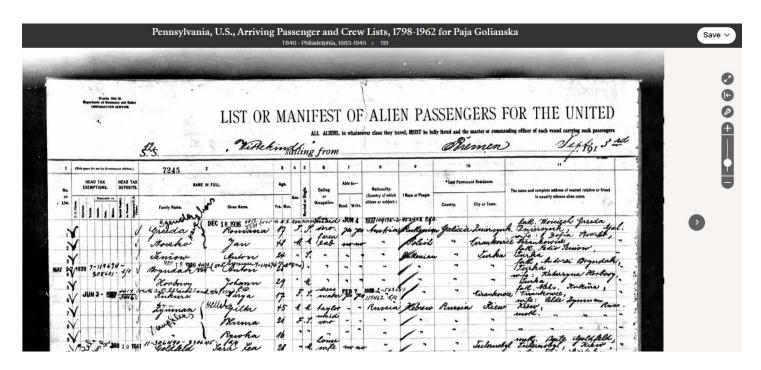
6. You will most likely see many records of individuals with the same name. Click **View Record when you find your relative's name.**



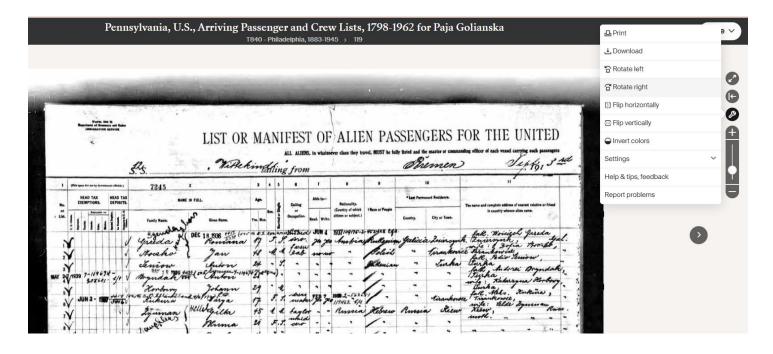
7. The **full record** will open with all of the information that appeared on the **passenger list**. Click on the image to make it larger.



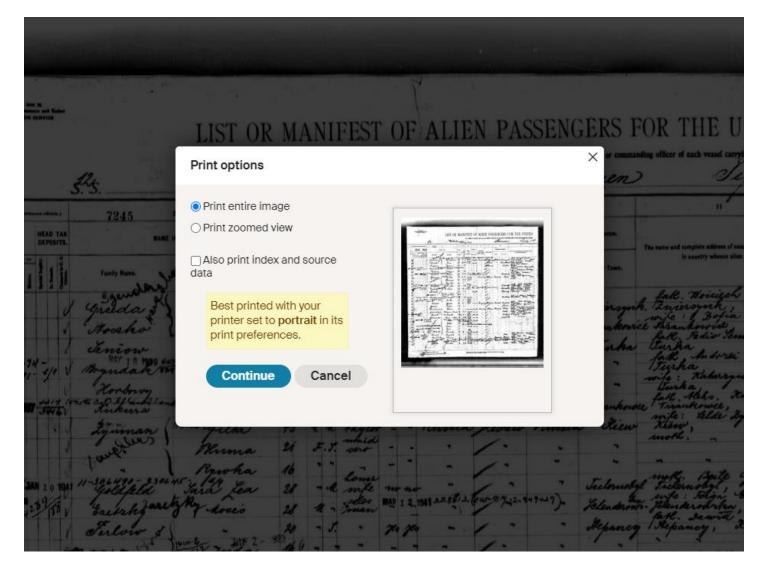
8. Click **Save** in the upper right corner and **Send Image Home** to send the document to yourself. Click **Save** and **Save to the Computer** to save it to a flash drive.



9. There will be a **hand** that appears on **top of the document**. Left click and drag to move the **image**. You can also click the **plus** or **minus signs** on the right side to **increase** or **decrease** the image size.



10. Click **the wrench icon** of the right side of the screen. Click **Print** to print the document.



- 11. The **default** print option is **Print entire image**. This will obviously print the entire list.
- 12. If you zoomed into the section of the list that has your relative's name you can print that larger image. Select **Print Zoomed View**.
- 13. Click Continue.
- 14. The **Print Window** will open. You can print your image from that window.
- 15. Click **Print**. You will get another window that will give you the **price of the copy**. Click **OK**.
- 16. There will be another **window** that pops up. Click **OK**.
- 17. You will retrieve the **item** at the **print release station**. You can ask for **assistance** from the **reference librarian**.
